

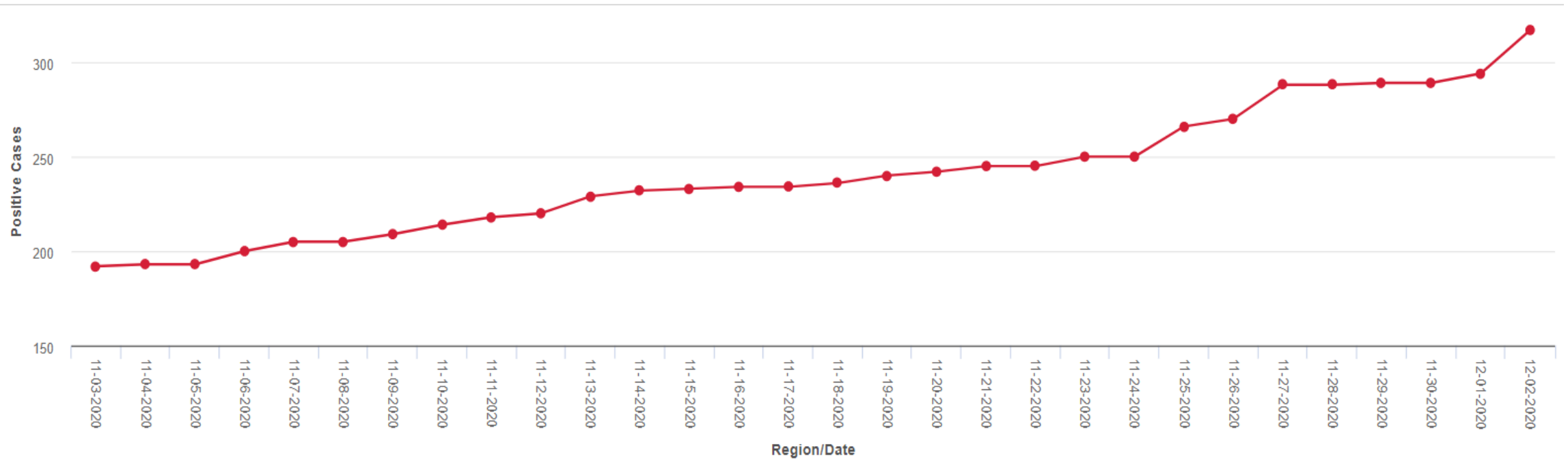

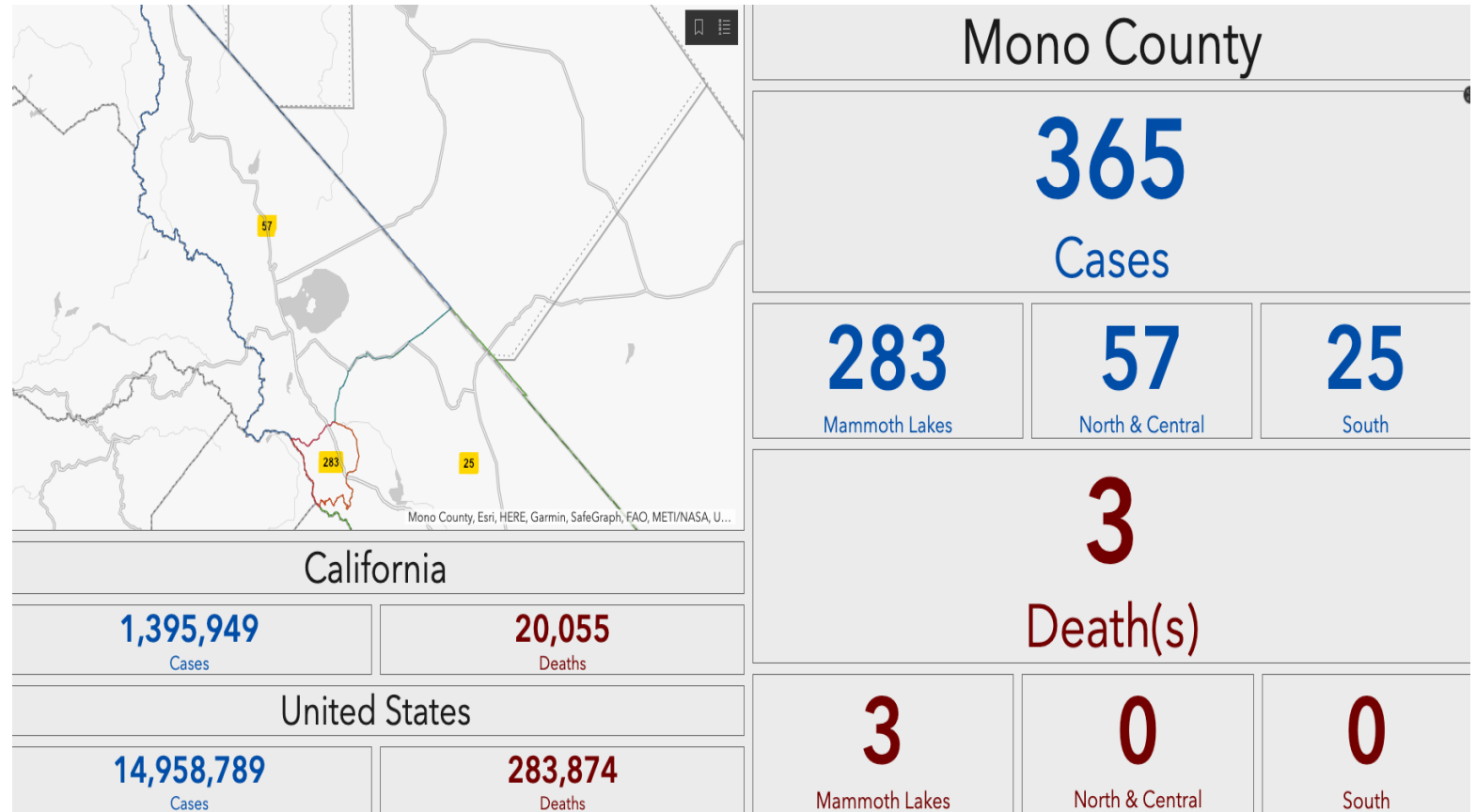


Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...

MONO COUNTY CASES BY REGION



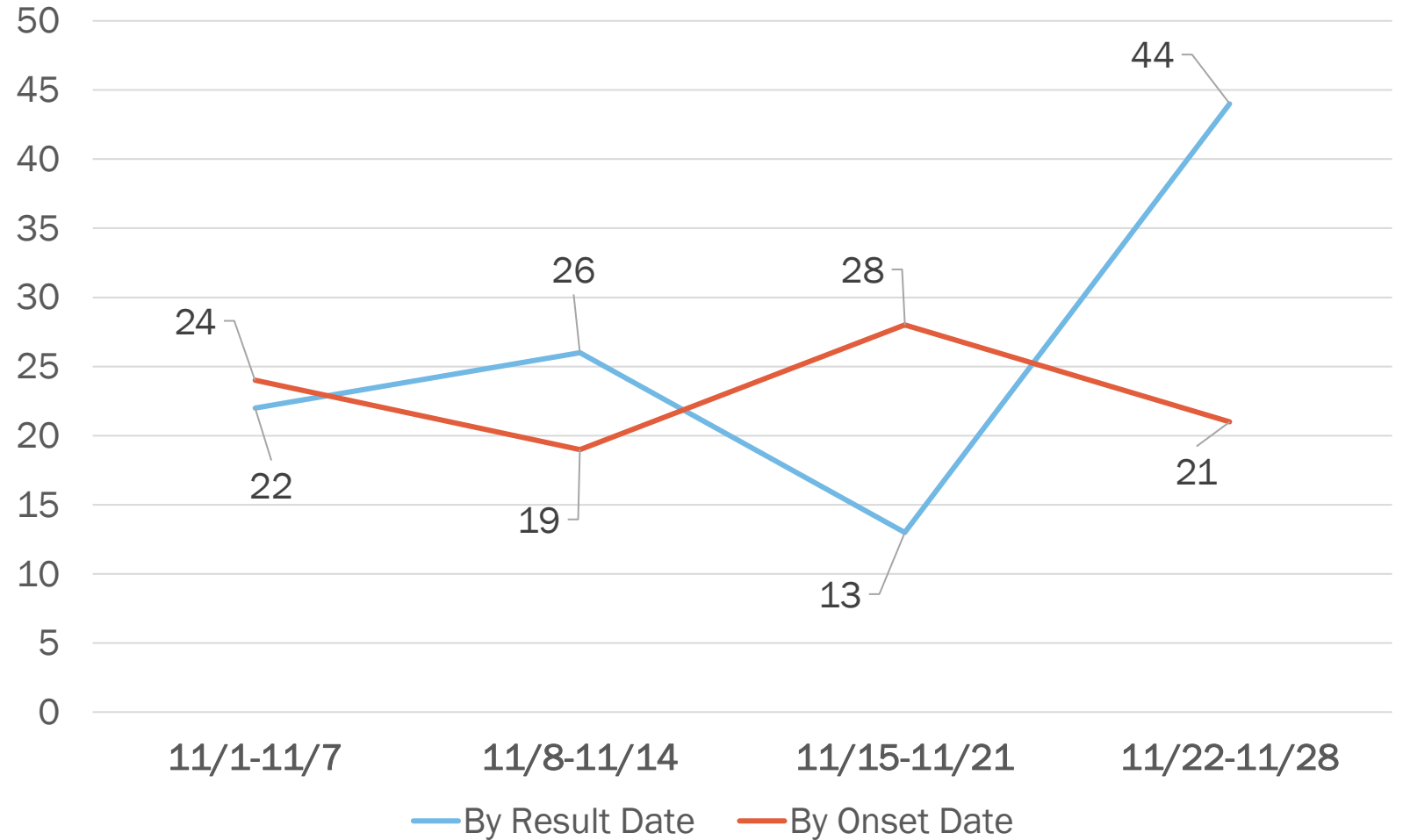
30-DAY METRICS

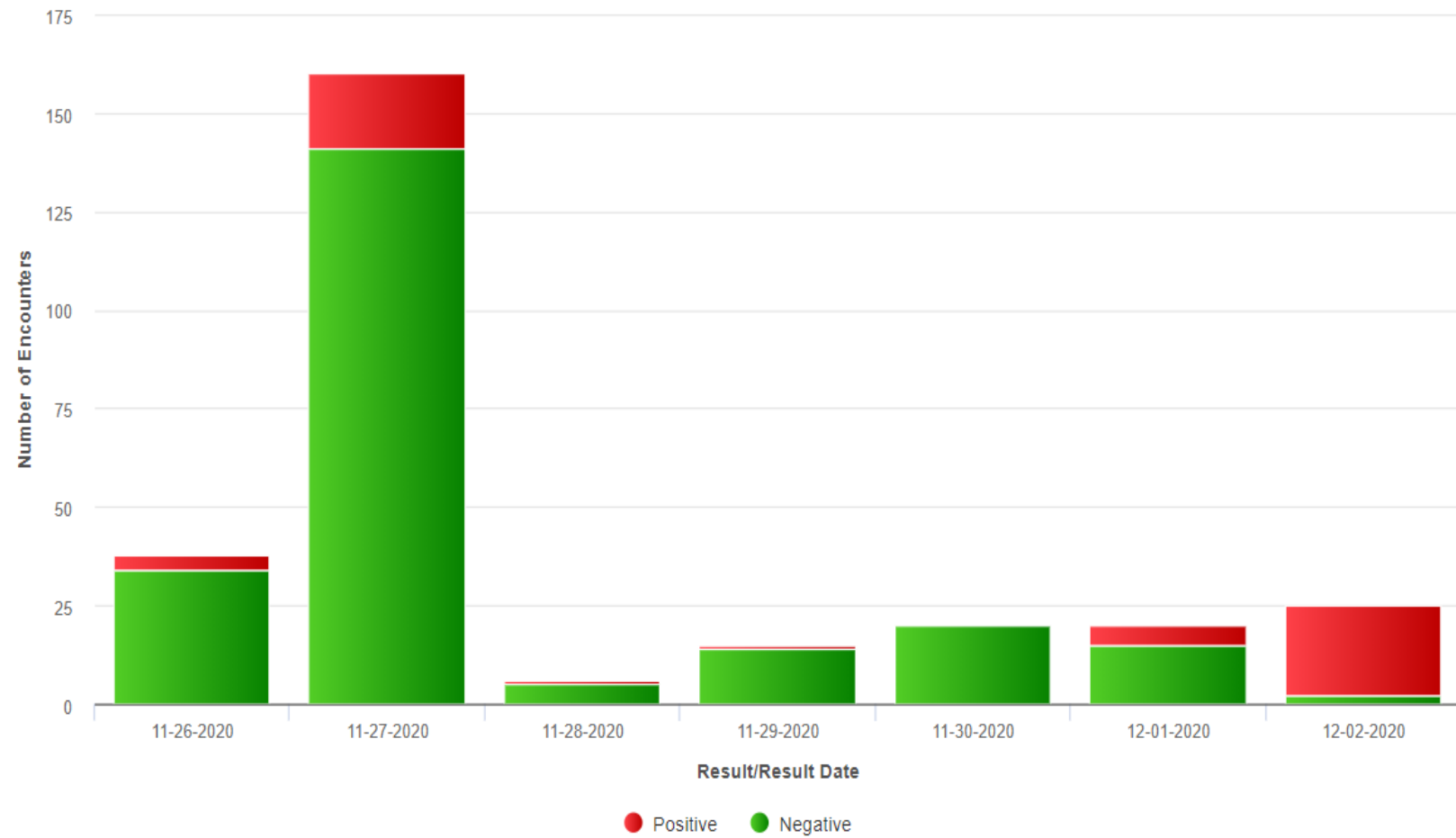
Mono County Positives per Week

REGIONAL STAY-AT-HOME ORDER



To blunt the surge and save lives, California introduced a Regional Stay-At-Home Order.

- The Regional Stay Home Order would be **in effect for at least 3 weeks** after the trigger and instructs Californians to stay at home as much as possible to limit the mixing with other households that can lead to COVID-19 spread.
- It allows access to (and travel for) **critical services** and **allows outdoor activities** to preserve Californians' physical and mental health.
- This limited closure will help **stop the surge** and prevent overwhelming regional ICU capacity.

REGIONAL STAY-AT-HOME ORDER



- Regions where ICU capacity falls below 15% will be placed into a Stay-at-Home Order for a **minimum of 3 weeks.**
- **Southern California*** (Mono County) fell below 15% ICU Capacity **12/05, and was placed under the Order effective 11:59PM 12/06.** This will be assessed on a weekly basis after the **initial 3-week period.**
- Current ICU Capacity: **10.9%**

REGIONAL STAY-AT-HOME ORDER



- All non-essential travel is temporarily restricted statewide.
- Sectors that will remain **OPEN** when a region is placed into the Stay-At-Home, include:
 - Critical infrastructure
 - Schools that are already open for in-person learning
 - Non-urgent medical and dental care
 - Child care and pre-K

REGIONAL STAY-AT-HOME ORDER



Sectors that are temporarily CLOSED when under the Regional Stay-At-Home Order include:

- Indoor and outdoor playgrounds
- Indoor recreational facilities
- Hair salons and barbershops
- Personal care services
- Museums, zoos, and aquariums
- Movie theaters
- Wineries
- Bars, breweries, and distilleries (no food)
- Family entertainment centers
- Cardrooms and satellite wagering
- Limited services
- Live audience sports
- Amusement parks

REGIONAL STAY-AT-HOME ORDER



The following sectors will have additional modifications in addition to **100% masking and physical distancing:**

- **Outdoor recreational facilities:** Allow outdoor operation only without any food, drink or alcohol sales. Additionally, overnight stays at campgrounds will not be permitted.
- **Retail:** Allow indoor operation at 20% capacity with entrance metering and no eating or drinking in the stores. Additionally, special hours should be instituted for seniors and others with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems. **NOTE: Grocery Store capacity increased to 35% 12/07.**
- **Shopping centers:** Allow indoor operation at 20% capacity with entrance metering and no eating or drinking in the stores. Additionally, special hours should be instituted for seniors and others with chronic conditions or compromised immune systems.
- **Hotels and lodging:** Allow to open for critical infrastructure support only.
- **Restaurants:** Allow only for take-out, pick-up, or delivery.
- **Offices:** Allow remote only except for critical infrastructure sectors where remote working is not possible.
- **Places of worship and political expression:** Allow outdoor services only.
- **Entertainment production including professional sports:** Allow operation without live audiences. Additionally, testing protocol and “bubbles” are highly encouraged.

PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER RELATED TO LODGING FACILITIES

- On 12/05, Mono County Public Health issued an **Order clarifying the Regional Stay-at-Home Order as it pertains to lodging facilities:**
- Under the Regional Stay-at-Home Order short-term lodging facilities (including short-term rentals, vacation rentals, timeshares, private residence clubs, hotels, condos, campgrounds, RV parks, and motels) within Mono County and the Town of Mammoth Lakes may remain open for the following purposes ONLY:
 - To serve as short-term lodging facilities for the following COVID-19 mitigation and containment measures:
 - Lodging to protect the homeless population and stranded travelers;
 - Lodging for persons who have been displaced and cannot return to their residence because there is a person residing at the residence who must isolate or quarantine or is at a higher risk of severe illness; and/or
 - Lodging for persons who need to isolate or quarantine.
 - Lodging facilities which are used to house workers performing essential functions (with modifications and requirements).
 - Lodging for persons who are displaced due to loss of homes from fire.
