Active Fire Behavior from today NORTH ZONE

Active fire behavior individual torching, uphill runs with occasional torching with relative humidity in the mid-teens to 20% and warmer temperatures aided the active fire behavior.

SOUTH ZONE


The fire continued to burn actively in the northern portion along the South Fork of the San Joaquin River. The fire continues to progress south along the solid rock rim of the drainage. The eastern side of the fire continues to burn to the east towards the Dinkey Lakes Wilderness. The fire continues to make active runs with torching.

Next Operational period – 12 Hours (Overnight) NORTH ZONE

Active fire behavior with short uphill runs and spotting. Areas that will show heat are in the East Fork Chiquito Creek and Central Camp Gaggs Camp Ground, Browns Creek and Camino Creek.

SOUTH ZONE

The weather will have a limited humidity recovery overnight allowing for more active burning. The fire will continue to burn actively in the higher elevations. The spread will be in the north and eastern portions of the fire where the smoke clears more in the evening and experiences increased winds.



Continues to burn to the North and west and east. The Northeast side is 7+/- miles from DEPO and 11+ miles from Lake Mary. The fire has extended along the South Fork to the Southeast. We will continue to see smoke.
