



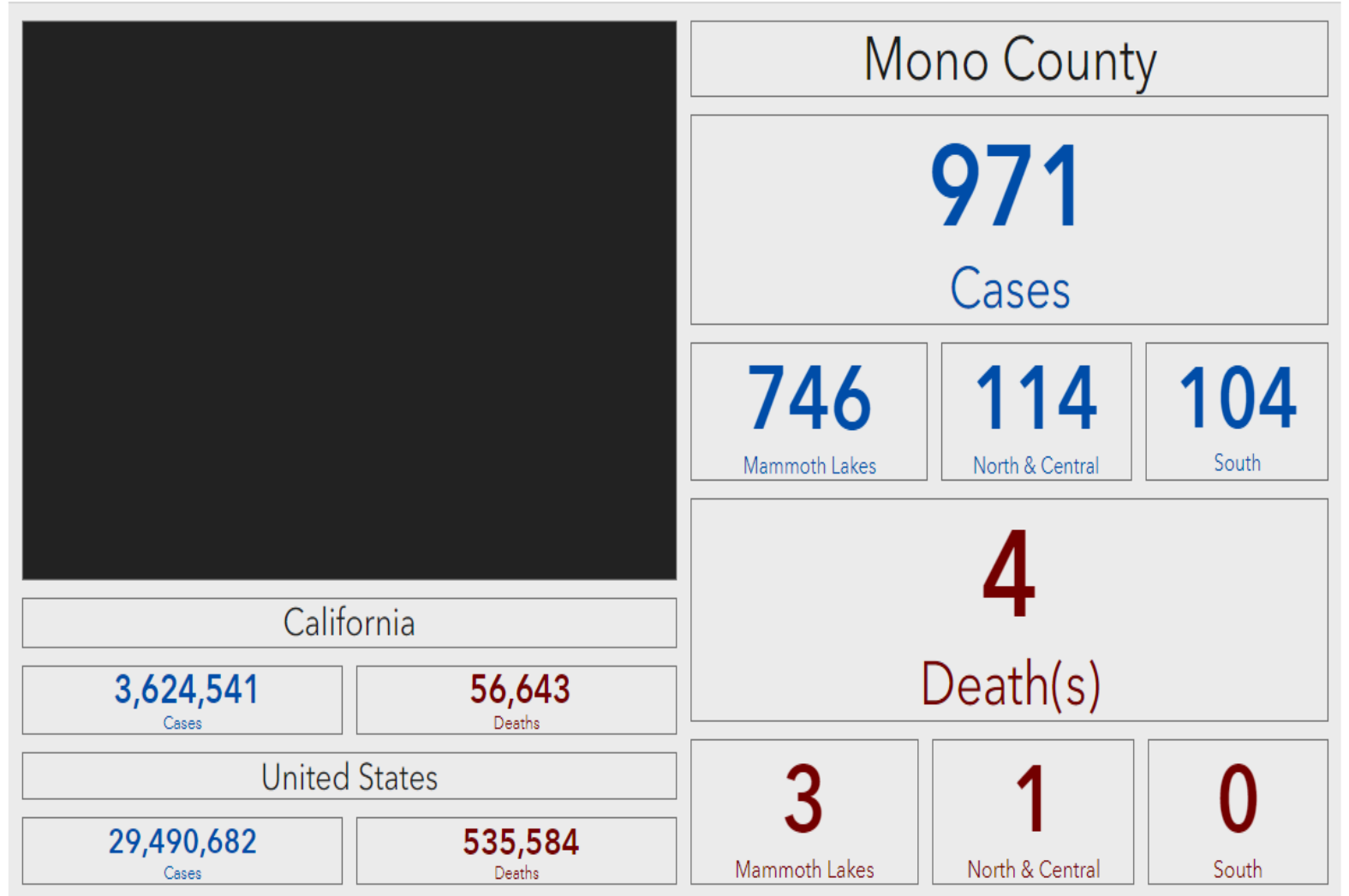

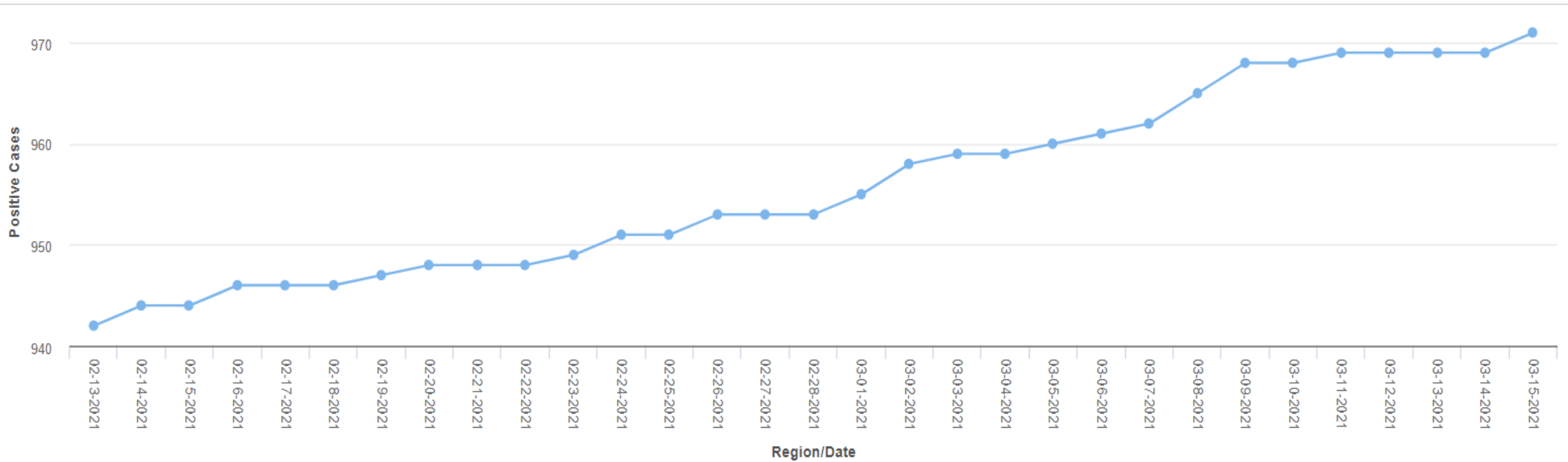
MONO COUNTY CASES BY REGION

Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...

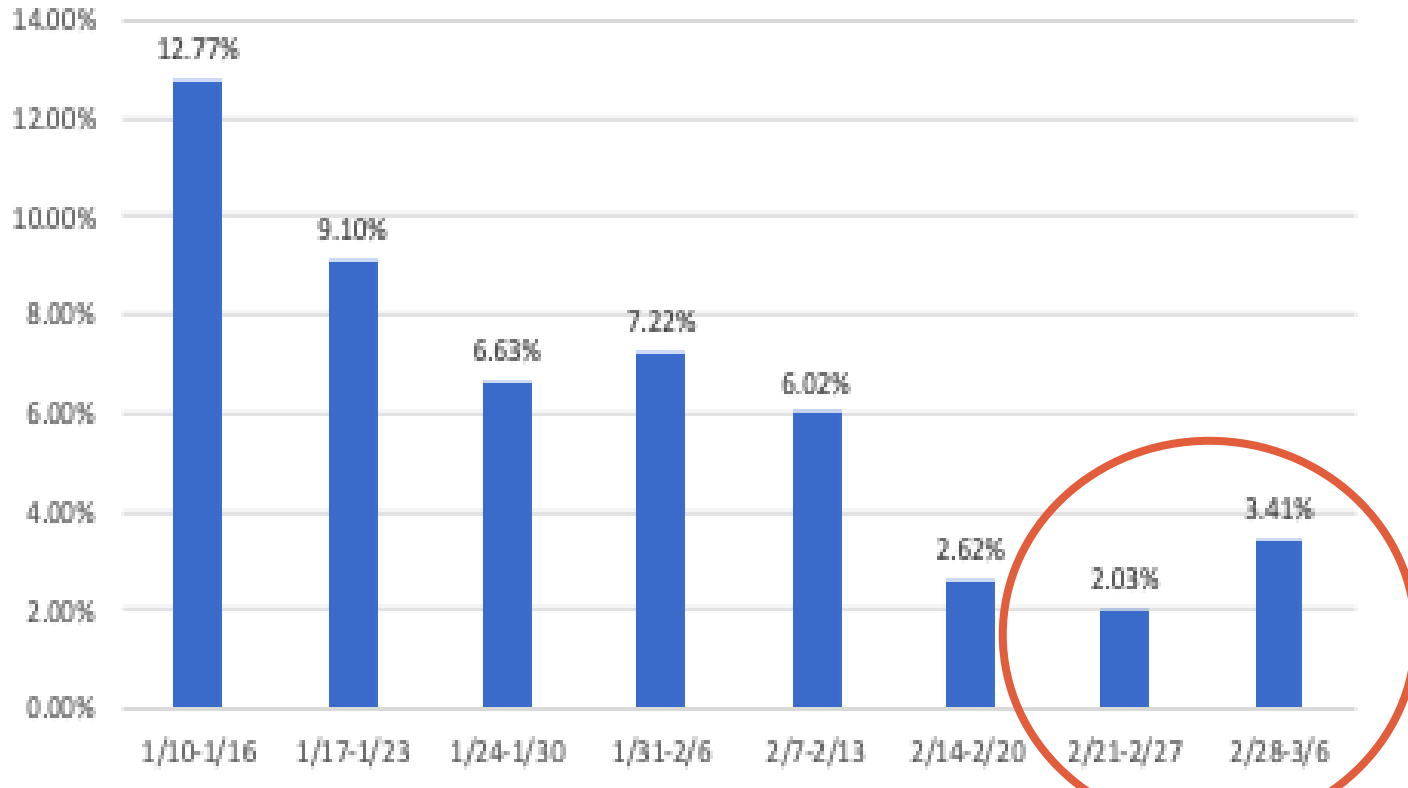

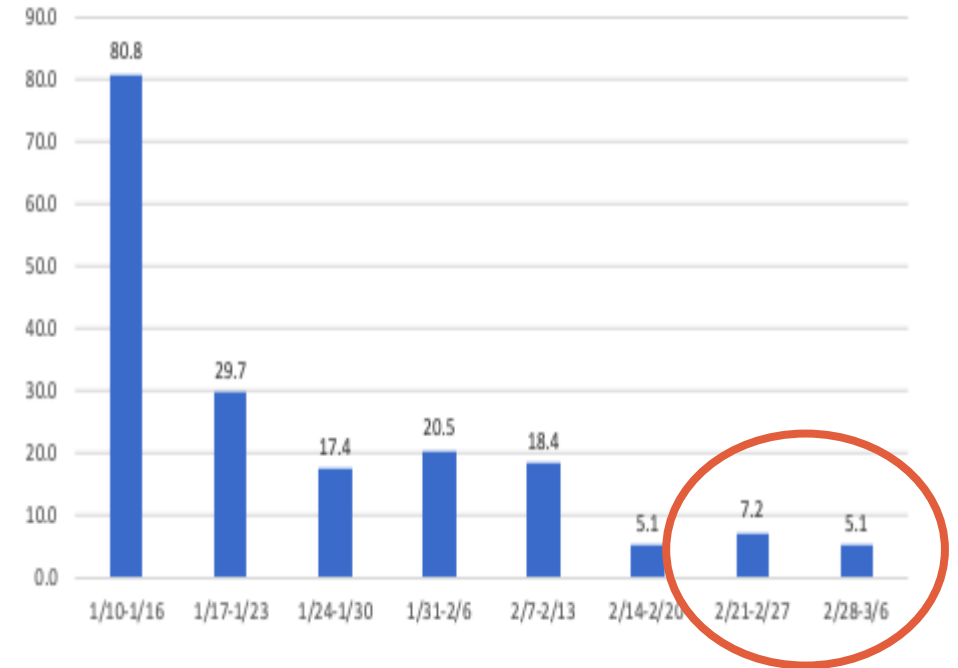

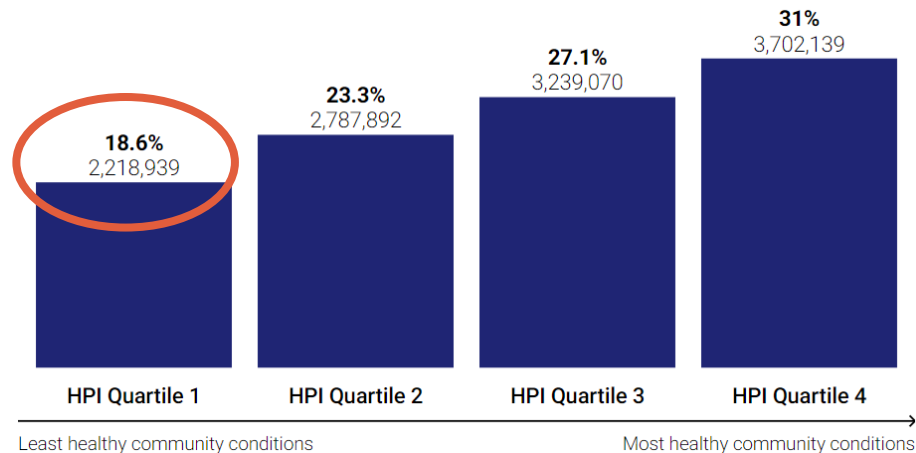

VACCINE EQUITY METRIC

Statewide Vaccine Equity Metric Goal #2:

Orange (Moderate) tier case rate range will shift to **2-5.9 cases per 100,000**. The Yellow (Minimal) tier case rate range will shift to less than **2 cases per 100,000** when:

- 4 million doses** have been administered to persons living in the Vaccine Equity Quartile (assessed statewide). **As of March 15, California is less than 1,781,061 doses away from its goal.**

BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY



State Metrics as of MARCH 6:

- ❑ Case Rate/100,000: 5.1 (8.1)*
 - ❑ Testing Positivity rate: 3.41% (2.8%)*
- As the metrics show, we have met the Testing Positivity rate (2-4.9%) and the Case Rate of less than 5.9 cases per 100,000 for the NEW Orange Tier for ONE WEEK.
- Counties must remain in a Tier for a minimum of three weeks before advancing.
- Under the new Guidelines** Mono County needs to meet both metrics for 2 consecutive weeks to move to the ORANGE TIER.

SMALL COUNTY FRAMEWORK



Moving through the Tiers...

- Small counties are subject to all existing Blueprint rules with the exception of the case rate thresholds as delineated below.
- The alternate case assessment measure provides a **small county protection against sudden tier changes as a result of small increases in cases.**
- If the county exceeds the **following absolute weekly case numbers based on its population and tier for two consecutive weeks**, it will be required to move to a more restrictive tier:

Current Tier	Pop ≤ 35K	Pop 35K-70K	Pop 70K-106K
Yellow	7	14	21
Orange	14	21	28
Red	35	42	49

 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 25%** of capacity, or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- *Movie Theaters*
 - Open indoors with modifications - **Max. 25%** of capacity, or 100 people, whichever is fewer
- *Hotels and Lodging*
 - Can Open Fitness Centers - **10%** capacity
 - Indoor Pools Closed
 - Outdoor Spas can open with modifications
 - **Town Lodging Order rescinded March 11, 2021**
- *Gyms and Fitness Centers*
 - Max **10%** capacity
 - Indoor Pools Closed
- *Family Entertainment Centers (including Bowling Alleys & Climbing Walls)*
 - Outdoor Only
 - Activity and Business Tiers

RE-OPENING DATES:

- Mammoth Elementary opened on **March 1** for TK through grade 2
- **Grades 3-5** opened on **March 8**
- Mammoth Middle School - **March 22**
- Mammoth High School - **March 22**

INFORMATION:

- All students and staff will need to wear a mask at all times.
- No visitors, volunteers or parents allowed into school buildings
- The MES program will be a "hybrid" or partial day program with AM/PM sessions Mondays through Thursdays, and then distance learning for all on Fridays.
- We will continue to offer the MILES program for students who want to remain on distance learning.

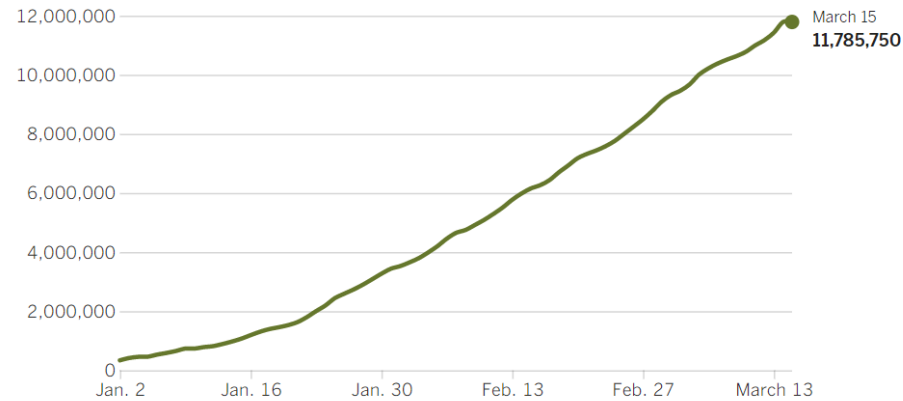

Cumulative doses administered



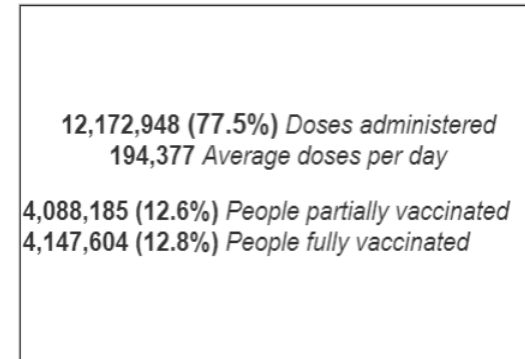

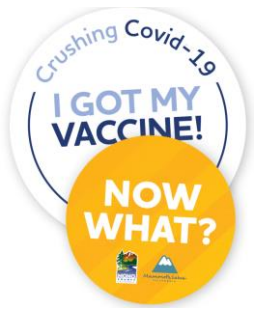

COVID-19 VACCINATION PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY REQUIRED



- Vaccines are allocated by the state according to permanent resident population
- To ensure Mono County is administering vaccines according to State guidelines, proof of eligibility is now required at the vaccination clinic. This includes, but is not limited to the following:
 - Driver's license/Real ID
 - DMV or Post Office Change-Of-Address
 - Employment paystub
 - Employee ID
 - Property Tax bill showing mailing address
 - Vehicle insurance showing mailing address
 - Any document that verifies you as a primary resident of Mono County
- Second homeowners are not currently eligible to receive the vaccine in Mono County



CDC INTERIM RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE

For the purposes of this guidance, people are considered **fully vaccinated** for COVID-19 ≥ 2 weeks after they have received the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna), or ≥ 2 weeks after they have received a single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson)

The following recommendations apply to non-healthcare settings. **Fully vaccinated people can:**

- Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Visit with unvaccinated people from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic

For now, fully vaccinated people should continue to:

- Wear masks, practice physical distancing, and adhere to other prevention measures when visiting with unvaccinated people who are at **increased risk for severe COVID-19** disease or who have an unvaccinated household member who is at increased risk for severe COVID-19 disease
- Wear masks, maintain physical distance, and practice other prevention measures when visiting with unvaccinated people from multiple households
- Avoid medium- and large-sized in-person gatherings & Get tested if experiencing **COVID-19 symptoms**
