MONO COUNTY ADVANCES TO LEAST RESTRICTIVE YELLOW TIER OF THE BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY

May 11, 2021 – Effective <u>Wednesday, May 12</u> the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has reassigned Mono County to the least restrictive **Tier 4, Minimal (Yellow)**, of the <u>Blueprint for a Safer</u> <u>Economy</u> (Blueprint), the State's "stringent and slow plan for living with COVID-19 (Coronavirus)." The Blueprint consists of four Tiers which rank a County's current infection rate and dictate the level of allowable operations within various business sectors. **Tier 4, Minimal (Yellow)** is the least restrictive Tier within the Blueprint, which is planned to expire on June 15 as the State moves to its "Beyond the Blueprint" plan.

Today, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration expanded the emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for the prevention of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) to include adolescents 12 through 15 years of age. The FDA amended the EUA originally issued on Dec. 11, 2020 for administration in individuals 16 years of age and older.

CDC ISSUES UPDATED PUBLIC HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FULLY VACCINATED PEOPLE (04/27)

Fully vaccinated people can:

- •Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
 •Visit with unvaccinated people (including children) from a single household who are at low risk for severe
 COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
 •Participate in outdoor activities and recreation without a mask, except in certain crowded settings and venues
 •Resume domestic travel and refrain from testing before or after travel or self-quarantine after travel
- •Refrain from testing before leaving the United States for international travel (unless required by the
- destination) and refrain from self-quarantine after arriving back in the United States
- •Refrain from testing following a known exposure, if asymptomatic, with some exceptions for specific settings
- •Refrain from quarantine following a known exposure if asymptomatic
- •Refrain from routine screening testing if asymptomatic and feasible
