









Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...

HOSPITAL STATUS

- Two hospitalizations over the weekend ending 8/8
- One case transferred to Renown
- Both cases were unvaccinated
- Both cases were visitors

VALENCIA STATE LABORATORY ERROR


- On 8/5 Mono County was sent erroneous lab results (collected 8/4) with a high positivity rate causing the unnecessary closing of businesses and isolation orders.
- Lab tech failed to follow protocols.
- The error was caught 11 hours after the results were released.
- Mono County was notified by the state the morning of 8/6.

WHY WE NEED TO MASK

- The Delta variant is the dominant strain of COVID-19 and a strain of concern.
- The COVID-19 vaccines are less effective in preventing infection with an efficacy rate of 64% -79%. Mono County joins the rest of the nation in experiencing an increasing rate of breakthrough cases.
- Vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals have the same viral load and can both transmit the virus to 5 to 8 others.
- The Delta variant is twice as transmissible and causes more severe disease.
- Numerous positive COVID-19 cases among our visitors

VACCINE EFFECTIVENESS IN THE FACE OF THE DELTA VARIANT

- The current vaccines are less effective at preventing infection and symptoms of COVID-19 and, the Delta variant.
- Breakthrough cases are on the rise.

WHY VACCINATE?

- The vaccine is the best way to prevent severe illness, hospitalizations, and death.
- The vaccines are 81% 96% effective in preventing severe illness, hospitalizations, and death.
- The best way to prevent illness in unvaccinated populations such as those under 12 years of age and those with certain health conditions.

SCHOOL OPENING

- Schools in Mono County open for inclassroom learning on 8/19.
- Masking is required by CDPH and Mono County.
- Public Health is coordinating with the schools to provide best practices, contact tracing, and testing.
- 94,000 pediatric cases last week nationally

COVID-19 TESTING SCHEDULE

- OptumServe, Mono County Medics, and Mono County Public Health each provide COVID-19 testing in Mono County.
- OptumServe offers testing on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 11am 7pm at the Mammoth Lakes Foundation (100 College Parkway). OptumServe testing will transition to the Mammoth Lakes Community Center effective August 17th. The team usually take a lunch break from 3pm - 4pm.
- Mono County Medics are offering Antigen testing in the following locations every Monday from 10:00am 12:00pm in August:
 - ♦ Walker Community Center (442 Mule Deer Road)
 - ♦ June Lake Community Center (90 W. Granite Avenue)
 - Bridgeport Memorial Hall (73 N. School Street)
