Background

- Resolution R-21-43 suspending operations of the Mono County Fish and Wildlife Commission; directing staff to return to the board with a workshop and recommendations.
- Staff met with local and regional CDFW employees and game warden.
- Staff met with other county commission members and staff

CA Advisory Commissions

- Of the 58 California counties, 15 have no advisory body.
 - F&G Funds were handled by staff
 - (Parks and Recreation or Planning departments)
 - Or handled directly by the Board of Supervisors




CA Advisory Commissions

- 9 have non-traditional advisory bodies.
 - Modoc "Fish, Game & Recreation Commission"
 - Napa "Wildlife Conservation Commission"
 - Yolo "Parks, Rec and Wildlife Commission"
 - Tuolumne "Fish and Game Preservation Fund Committee"
 - Fresno "Recreation and Wildlife Commission"



CA Advisory Commissions

- 34 have traditional "Fish" or "Fish and Wildlife" Commissions
 - Traditional Fish & Wildlife issues
 - Recommend F&W Fine Fund expenditures



Moving Forward...

Determine scope: What advisement or public expertise is the board seeking?

What is the best use of staff time and resources?

Scenario 1 – F&G Fund Committee

Yearly or twice a year committee that meets to formally take F&G Fine Fund project requests for board approval.

Create a formal grant application process and evaluation system.

Issue: No other advisement on other fish and wildlife related issues.

Scenario 2 - No Further Action

Continue disbandment

Staff and Board manage F&G Fine Fund requests and expenditures

Issue: Public vetting or input based on relevant issue and necessity.

Scenario 3 – Reinstate Fish & Wildlife Commission

- Reinstate Fish and Wildlife Commission
 - Scope: Advise the Board of Fish and Wildlife related issues and recommend F&G Fine Fund Expenditure.
 - 5 members, one commissioner for each board member that expires with the corresponding supervisor's term.
 - Meet Quarterly with a yearly rotating Chair and Vice Chair.

Issue: Historical issues could persist.

Scenario 4 - Staff Recommendation

Create a grant application program administered by the Economic Development

Department for F&W Fine Fund Expenditures.

- Similar yearly grant cycle as the Community Events Market Fund, Historical Societies Grant Program and Performing and Visual Arts program
- Board of Supervisors would still approve yearly requests.
- Fish and wildlife issues would be brought to the board for public input and desired action.

Next Steps

- No resolution needed for staff to create a Fish and Wildlife grant program for Board approval.
- Staff would continue to still manage fish stocking and budgets.
- Staff would continue to manage emerging fish and wildlife issues with the board.
- Staff can create the program to include in our November grant cycle.
