









Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...






POST VACCINATION INFECTIONS (BREAKTHROUGH)



HOSPITAL STATUS

- 1 current COVID-19 related hospitalizations.
- Transfer hospitals continue to experience extremely limited ICU capacity causing delays or the inability to transfer patients in a timely manner.

MAMMOTH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT UPDATE

- Mammoth Middle School and Mammoth High school returned to in seat learning on 9/27/21.
- The State outbreak response team and Mono County Public Health performed approximately 1200 PCR and rapid Antigen tests to safely reopen schools.

COVID VACCINE SCHOOL MANDATE

- California Becomes First State in Nation to Announce COVID-19 Vaccine Requirements for Schools
- After implementing first-in-the-nation school masking and staff vaccination measures, California becomes the first state to announce plans to require student vaccinations – adding the COVID-19 vaccine to list of vaccinations required for school, such as the vaccines for measles, mumps, and rubella
- Students will be required to be vaccinated for in person learning starting the term following FDA full approval of the vaccine for their grade span (7-12 and K-6).

LIMITED STATE RESOURCES AND INCREASED TESTING

- State resources, both human and material, remain in short supply.
- We continue to experience staffing shortages for response teams, testing sites, and contact tracing.
- Demand for testing remains high due to increased infection rate, school testing, and required workforce testing.

BOOSTER SHOTS FOR THOSE WITH COMPROMISED IMMUNE SYSTEMS

- Active treatment for solid tumor and hematologic malignancies.
- Receipt of solid-organ <u>transplant</u> and taking immunosuppressive therapy.
- Receipt of CAR-T-cell or hematopoietic stem cell transplant (within 2 years of transplantation or taking immunosuppression therapy).
- Moderate or severe <u>primary immunodeficiency</u> (e.g., DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome).
- Advanced or untreated <u>HIV infection.</u>
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids (i.e., ≥20mg prednisone or equivalent per day), alkylating agents, antimetabolites, transplant-related immunosuppressive drugs, cancer chemotherapeutic agents classified as severely immunosuppressive, tumor-necrosis (TNF) blockers, and other biologic agents that are immunosuppressive or immunomodulatory.

PFIZER BOOSTERS FOR THE GENERAL POPULATION

- COVID-19 Vaccine booster shots are available for the following Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine recipients who completed their initial series at least 6 months ago:
 - 65 years and older
 - 18+ who have <u>underlying medical conditions</u>
 - 18+ who work in <u>high-risk settings</u>
 - 18+ who live in <u>high-risk settings</u>
- Moderna and J&J booster guidance expected soon but no date or information regarding elegability
