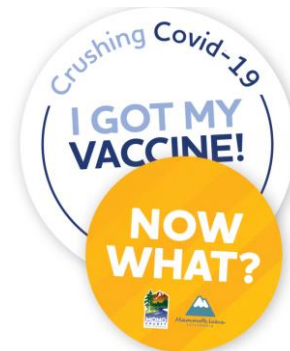


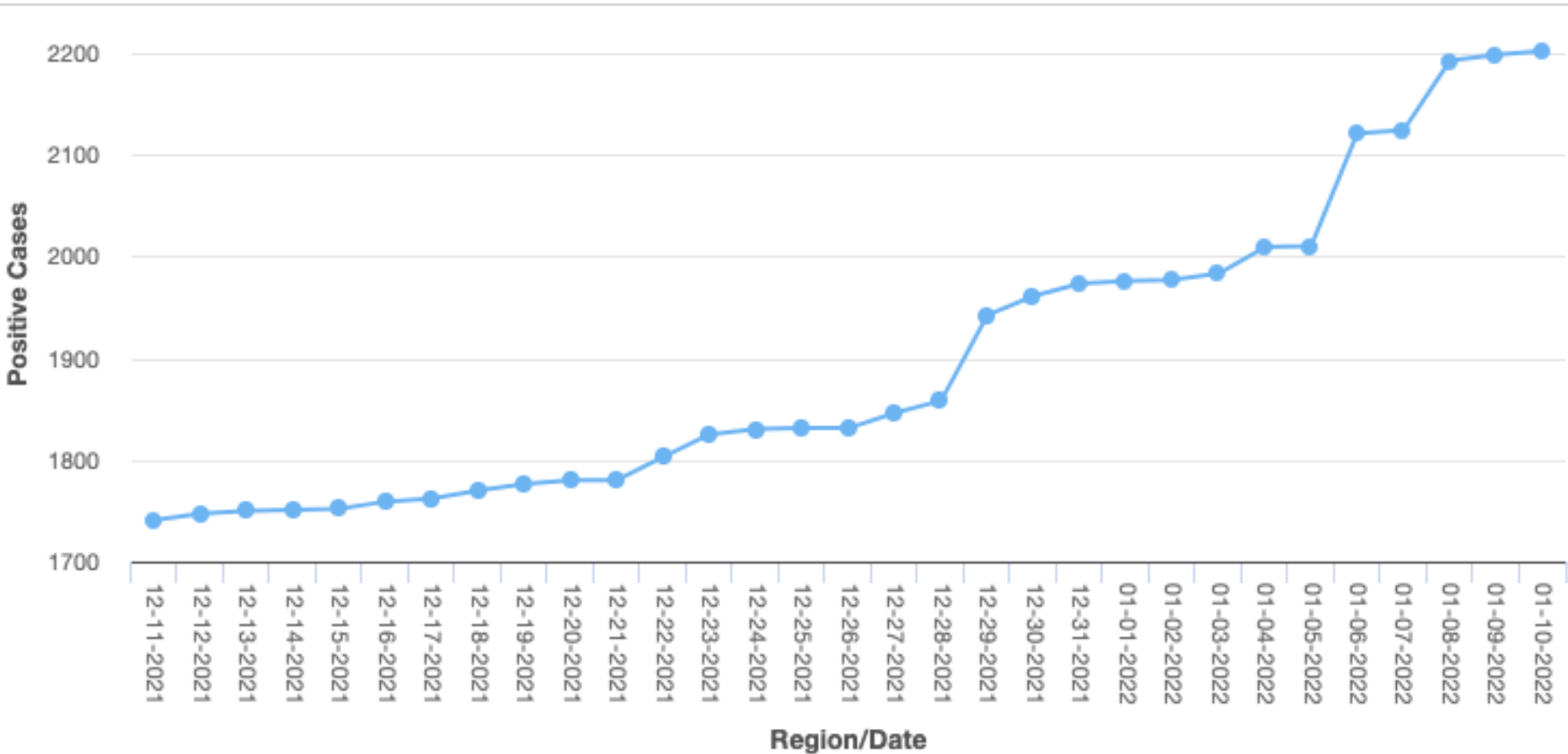

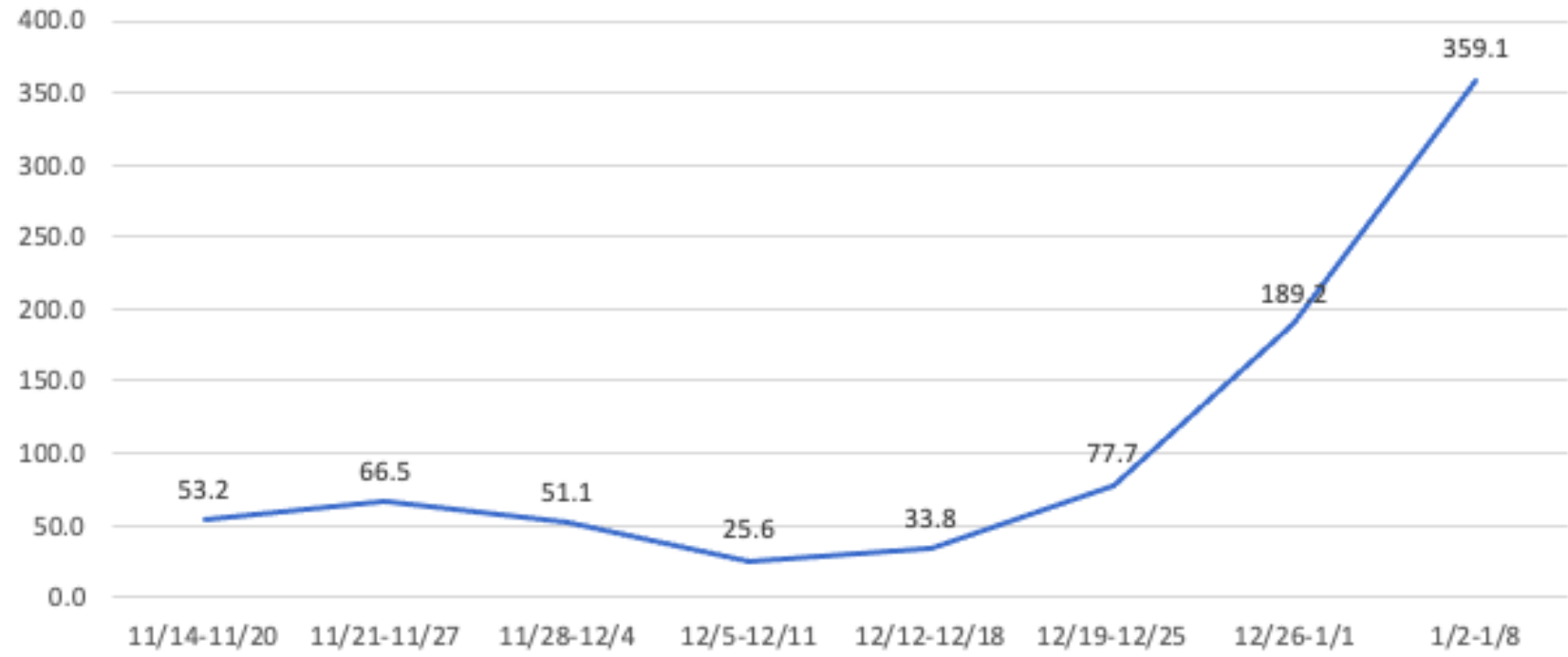
# Total Positive Cases for Mono County Residents (last 30 d...



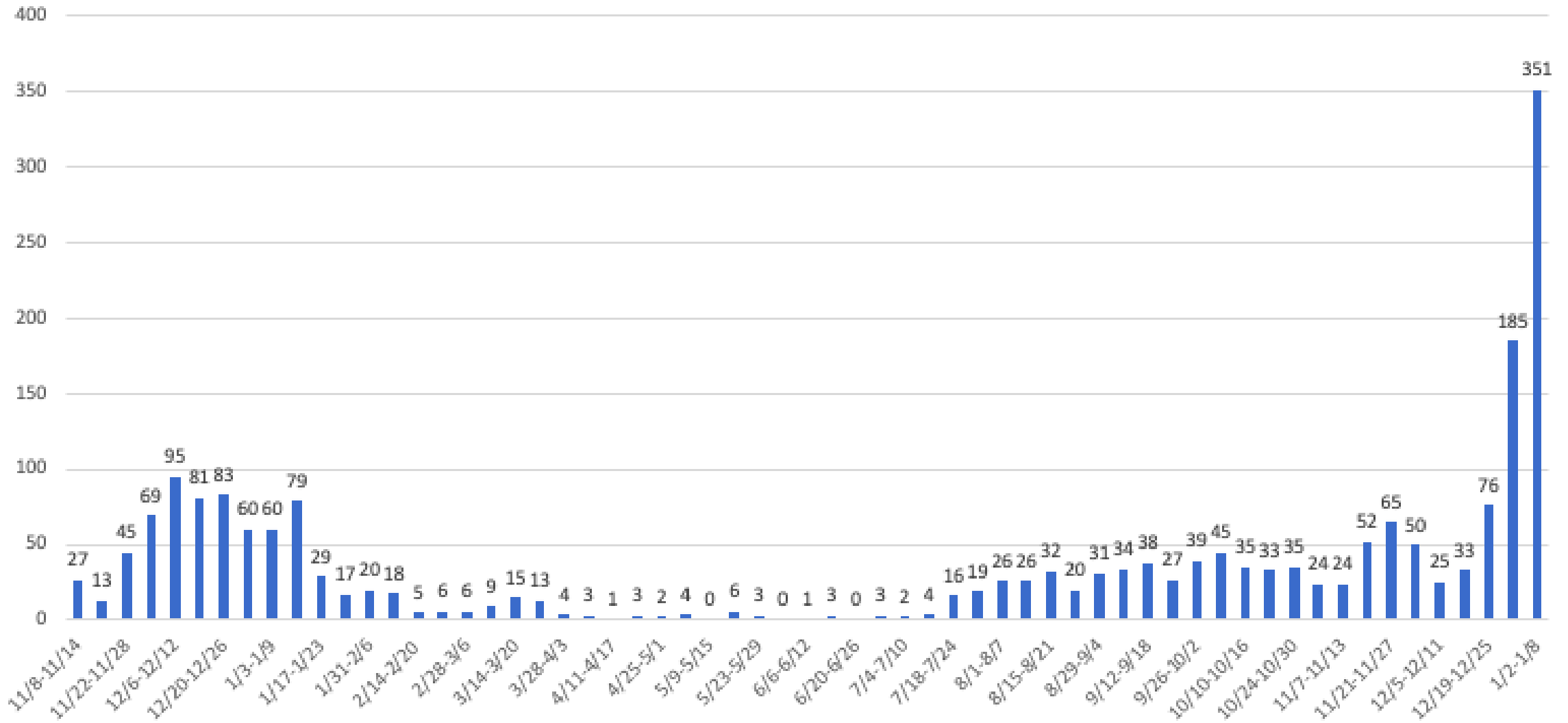
TOTAL POSITIVE CASES (PCR CONF): 2205 POSITIVITY RATE: 43% / CASE RATE/100,000: 359.1

## **BOOSTER DATA**

- 3520+ COVID-19 third doses have been administered to Mono County Residents.



## **BOOSTER ELIGIBILITY**

- Boosters for 16–17-year-old individuals were approved by the FDA on 12/09/2021
- Boosters for 12–15-year-old individuals were approved by FDA 01/04/2022.
  - On 01/06/2022 CDPH and Western Scientific Group endorsed boosters for this age group.

## HOSPITAL STATUS

- One current COVID-19 related hospitalization
- Difficulty transferring patients
- Seeing many ski related injuries and multiple COVID-19 cases daily
- Staffing shortage
- Status = Green.

# NEW ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE GUIDANCE

## If You Test Positive for COVID-19 (Isolate)

- **Everyone, regardless of vaccination status:**
  - **Stay home** (PDF) for at least 5 days.
  - Isolation can end after day 5 if symptoms are not present or are resolving **and** a diagnostic specimen\* collected on day 5 or later tests negative.
  - If unable to test or choosing not to test, and symptoms are not present or are resolving, isolation can end after day 10.
  - If fever is present, isolation should be continued until fever resolves.
  - If symptoms, other than fever, are not resolving continue to isolate until symptoms are resolving or until after day 10.
  - Wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings (see Section below on masking for additional information)
- *\*Antigen test preferred.*

# NEW ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE GUIDANCE

## If You Were Exposed to COVID-19 (Quarantine)

- [Stay home](#) (PDF) for at least 5 days, after your last contact with a person who has COVID-19.
- Test on day 5.
- Quarantine can end after day 5 if symptoms are not present **and** a diagnostic specimen collected on day 5 or later tests negative.
- If unable to test or choosing not to test, and symptoms are not present, quarantine can end after day 10.
- Wear a well-fitting mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings (see Section below on masking for additional information).
- Strongly encouraged to get vaccinated or boosted.
- If testing positive, follow isolation recommendations above.
- If symptoms develop, test and stay home.

## **NEW ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE GUIDANCE**

### **If You Were Exposed to COVID-19 (No Quarantine) If Boosted or not yet eligible for a booster**

- Test on day 5.
- Wear a well-fitting mask around others for 10 days, especially in indoor settings (see Section below on masking for additional information)
- If testing positive, follow isolation recommendations above.
- If symptoms develop, test and stay home.

## TEMPORARY CLOSURE FOR IN- PERSON INSTRUCTION AT MUSD

- **January 08, 2022** – Effective Monday, January 10, 2022, Dr. Caryn K. Slack, Mono Health Officer, ordered the temporary closure of in-person instruction and indoor activities within the Mammoth Unified School District's (MUSD) Mammoth High School, Mammoth Middle School, Mammoth Elementary School, Sierra High School, Husky Club, Mono County Office of Education's Inclusive Preschool on the campus of Mammoth Elementary School, and Inyo-Mono Advocates for Community Action Mammoth Head Start Preschool.
- This closure was in response to a dramatic increase in COVID-19 (Coronavirus) cases, and the resulting impacts on staffing and resources upon local schools.

# TEMPORARY CLOSURE FOR IN- PERSON INSTRUCTION AT MUSD

- Approximately 23% of students and 19% of staff are unable to be physically present within MUSD schools due to illness or quarantine.
- This drastic shortage of staff restricts the ability of MUSD to ensure compliance with CDPH guidelines.
- Mono County and MUSD consulted with CDPH on this closure.

# NATIONAL GUARD TO ASSIST OPTUMSERVE WITH COVID TESTING

- **January 09, 2022** – On January 7, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom activated the California National Guard to support local communities in their response to the escalating demand for COVID-19 (Coronavirus) testing.
- Mono County was assigned National Guard members who will provide increased capacity at the Sierra Star Clubhouse (2001 Sierra Star Pkwy.) OptumServe testing site in Mammoth Lakes.



## **OMICRON SURGE B.1.1.259 LINEAGE**

- Milder symptoms in general
- Upper respiratory symptoms
- Adolescents at higher risk due to undeveloped airway
- Sore throat and earache leading first symptom.
