An important message from the Mono County Registrar of Voters about the November 3, 2020 General Election.

MAIL IT IN MONO!

Dear Mono County Voter:

Per an order by Governor Newsom, all voters will be receiving a ballot in the mail by October 5, regardless of whether you usually vote by mail.

IT'S EASY: Without making any changes to your current registration, a ballot will be mailed to you!

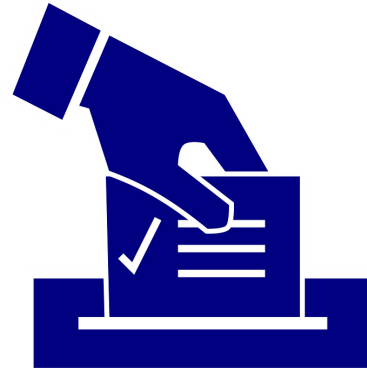
IT'S SAFE: You can mark your ballot safely at home.

IT'S SECURE: Once you mark your ballot, place it in your postage pre-paid envelope, seal, sign, and date the envelope, and return it by mail promptly. If you don't want to use the US Postal Service, you can drop your ballot at one of our secure ballot drop boxes in the county, at any polling location, or at our main office in Bridgeport.

When we receive your ballot, your signature on your envelope will be verified by comparing it to the signature on your voter registration to make sure they match. Your signature is required for your ballot to count so please sign your name as it appears on your driver's license or other identification card.

As your County Registrar, I urge you to vote your mailed ballot at home and return it immediately! Our goal is to keep voters and our community safe! If you can't vote by mail, in-person voting options are available (see below).

WHAT'S NEW!

All registered and active Mono County voters will receive a ballot in the mail.

- Per Governor Newsom, all voters will have the option of voting by mail from the safety of their homes, reducing exposure to COVID-19.
- Your mailed ballot is easy to return by Nov. 3: drop the pre-paid return envelope at the post office, in any of our community ballot drop boxes, at any polling location on Election Day or stop by our main office in Bridgeport.
- The Elections Office is committed to providing a safe and secure voting experience that is accessible and convenient.

You will be able to track your mail ballot.

- You will know when it has been mailed, received, and counted by the Election Office.

YOU CAN STILL VOTE IN PERSON ON ELECTION DAY!

- We will have all of our regular polling places open on Election Day and will be following strict COVID-19 safety guidelines.
- These locations are open only on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Please see the back cover of your Voter Information Guide for your polling location.
- **Bring the ballot you received in the mail. If you do not bring the ballot you received in the mail, you may have to cast a provisional ballot.**
- Do your part: please practice social distancing and wear a mask when at the polls to help protect not only yourself, but others as well!
- Plan ahead: due to the safety requirements, things might take a little longer. This is for your safety!

BE PROACTIVE!

- Make sure your voter registration is up to date.
- With every voter receiving a ballot in the mail we want to make sure there are no delays.

- If you need to make changes to your registration, you can re-register to vote at www.registertovote.ca.gov. It only takes a few minutes!
