What's New?

All registered and active Mono County voters will receive a ballot in the mail.

- Per Governor Newsom, all voters will have the option of voting by mail from the safety of their homes, reducing exposure to COVID-19.
- Your mailed ballot is easy to return: drop the pre-paid return envelope at the post office, in any of our community ballot drop boxes, at any polling location on Election Day or stop by our main office in Bridgeport.
- The Elections Office is committed to providing a safe and secure voting experience that is accessible and convenient.

You will be able to track your mail ballot.

- You will know when it has been mailed, received, and counted by the Elections Office.
- It's easy to sign up! Visit www.WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov today.

You can still vote in person on Election Day!

- We will have all of our regular polling places open on Election Day and will be following strict COVID-19 safety guidelines.
- These locations are open only on Election Day from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Please see the back cover of your Voter Information Guide for your polling location.
- Bring the ballot you received in the mail. If you do not bring the ballot you received in the mail, you may have to cast a provisional ballot.
- Do your part: please practice social distancing and wear a mask when at the polls to help protect not only yourself, but others as well!
- Plan ahead: due to the safety requirements, things might take a little longer. This is for your safety!

Be Proactive!

Make sure your voter registration is up to date.

- With every voter receiving a ballot in the mail we want to make sure there are no delays.
- Please verify your voter information with the Elections Office (by calling 760-932-5537) or by visiting <https://voterstatus.sos.ca.gov>. If you need to make changes to your registration, you can re-register to vote at www.registertovote.ca.gov. It only takes a few minutes!

HOW TO MARK YOUR BALLOT

To vote

To vote for a candidate, completely fill in the oval next to your choice.

To vote on any measure, completely fill in the oval next to the word “YES” or the word “NO”.

Important:

Check both the front and the back of your ballot for voting contests.
Do not use red ink.

To vote for a qualified write-in candidate:

To vote for a write-in candidate, write the person’s name in the blank space provided directly below the names of the other candidates for the office. Then completely fill in the oval next to your choice.

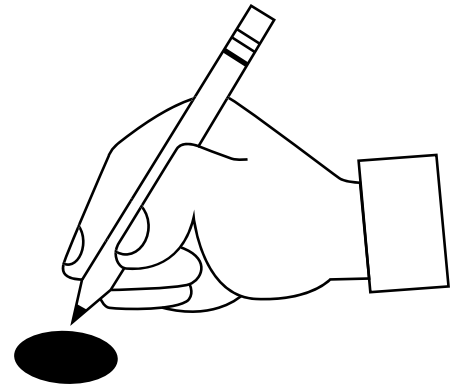
Review your ballot:

If you vote for more candidates than allowed, or if you vote both Yes and No on a measure, your vote will not count for that contest. You do not have to vote on all contests. Those you do vote on will still count. If you make a mistake ask for another ballot.

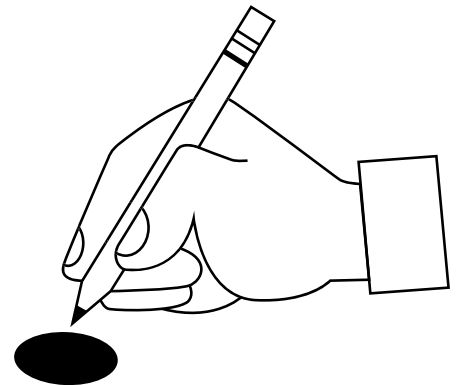

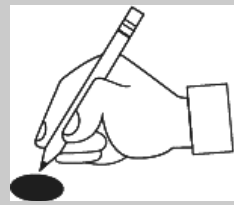

VOTER-NOMINATED AND NONPARTISAN OFFICES
 All voters, regardless of the party preference they disclosed upon registration, or refusal to disclose a party preference, may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated or nonpartisan office. The party preference, if any, designated by a candidate for a voter-nominated office is selected by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party or that the party approves of the candidate. The party preference, if any, of a candidate for a nonpartisan office does not appear on the ballot.

PROPÓSITOS

Para proporcionar ingresos locales que el estado no pueda tomar y para mantener una educación pública de alta calidad en las escuelas del Distrito Escolar Unificado Mammoth (el “Distrito”), el Distrito propone gravar y recaudar un impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación anualmente durante 5 años como se describe más detalladamente a continuación en “IMPUESTO SOBRE LA PARCELA PARA LA EDUCACIÓN Y PROCEDIMIENTOS” e implementar medidas de rendición de cuentas en relación al impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación y proveer supervisión y responsabilización para garantizar que los fondos se usen solo para los siguientes propósitos específicos:

- proporcionar libros y suministros a los estudiantes
- atraer y conservar a maestros calificados y eficientes
- proporcionar tecnología actualizada, que incluya software, hardware y soporte
- mantener grupos pequeños para los primeros grados

- mantener el personal y los servicios de biblioteca
- mantener y mejorar los programas de idiomas del Distrito
- mantener y mejorar los programas de música, arte y enriquecimiento del Distrito
- mantener actividades extracurriculares y programas de atletismo
- mantener y promover los programas educativos necesarios

La Junta de Educación no financiará ningún programa que no sea alguno de los antes listados, con los ingresos del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación.

IMPUESTO SOBRE LA PARCELA PARA LA EDUCACIÓN Y PROCEDIMIENTOS

Monto del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación. Sujeto a la aprobación de dos tercios de los votantes, el impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación de \$59 por parcela (excepto las parcelas exentas descritas a continuación) estará en vigor durante 5 años a partir del año fiscal 2022-2023 y será cobrado por el recaudador de impuestos del condado de Mono al mismo tiempo y junto con los impuestos generales ad valorem recaudados por dicho recaudador de impuestos y estará sujeto a las mismas sanciones que estos.

Definición de parcela. Una parcela se definirá como cualquier unidad de tierra del Distrito que recibe una factura de impuestos independiente por parte de la oficina del recaudador de impuestos del condado de Mono.

Exenciones. Se aplicarán las siguientes exenciones a la recaudación del impuesto especial calificado.

- Propiedad exenta de otra manera. Toda propiedad que de otra manera estaría exenta de impuestos sobre la propiedad también estará exenta del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación.
- Exención para ciudadanos de la tercera edad. Estará disponible una exención para las personas que tengan 65 años o más, y posean y ocupen como residencia principal una parcela sujeta al impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación.

Los propietarios que busquen la exención para ciudadanos de la tercera edad deben solicitar al Distrito dicha exención según los procedimientos establecidos por el Distrito o según lo exigido por la legislación o el recaudador de impuestos del condado de Mono. Sin embargo, los propietarios que ya hayan calificado para una exención para ciudadanos de la tercera edad contemplada en la actual medida del impuesto sobre la parcela del Distrito aprobada por los votantes en junio de 2016 automáticamente calificarán para una exención de acuerdo con esta medida.

Procedimientos exclusivos. Los procedimientos descritos en este documento con respecto al gravamen y la recaudación del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación y sus exenciones, y cualquier procedimiento adicional establecido por la Junta de Educación del Distrito, serán el procedimiento de reclamo exclusivo para los demandantes que busquen una exención, reembolso, reducción o recálculo del impuesto especial calificado. El Distrito, en coordinación con el condado en caso necesario, determinará si un reclamo en particular debe ser resuelto por el Distrito o por el condado. La Junta de Educación del Distrito puede adoptar los procedimientos adicionales o complementarios que considere necesarios o convenientes para la administración del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación.

MEDIDAS DE RENDICIÓN DE CUENTAS

Rendición de cuentas del Código del Gobierno. De acuerdo con los requisitos de las secciones 50075.1 y 50075.3 del Código del Gobierno de California, se aplicarán las siguientes medidas de rendición de cuentas, entre otras, a los impuestos especiales calificados gravados de acuerdo con esta medida:

- los propósitos específicos del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación serán los propósitos antes identificados bajo el encabezado “PROPÓSITOS”;
- los ingresos del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación se aplicarán solo a los fines específicos antes identificados bajo el encabezado “PROPÓSITOS”;
- se creará una cuenta especial independiente en la que deberán depositarse los ingresos del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación, y
- la directora de Comercio y Finanzas del Distrito debe presentar un informe anual por escrito ante la Junta de Educación del Distrito que muestre (1) el monto de fondos recaudados y gastados de los ingresos del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación y (2) el estado de cualquier proyecto, programa o propósito antes identificado bajo el encabezado “PROPÓSITOS”.

Comité Supervisor de Ciudadanos. Además de las medidas de rendición de cuentas requeridas por el Código del Gobierno, la Junta de Educación nombrará un Comité de Supervisión Ciudadana Independiente para asesorar a la junta sobre los gastos financiados por la medida a fin de garantizar que dichos fondos se gasten en los propósitos aprobados por los votantes. El Comité Supervisor de Ciudadanos monitoreará los gastos de estos fondos hechos por el Distrito y reportará anualmente a la Junta y a la comunidad cómo se han gastado estos fondos.

Auditorías anuales independientes. El Distrito contratará a un auditor independiente externo para realizar auditorías anuales que revisen los ingresos y los gastos del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación para confirmar que los fondos se gastan en los fines descritos en la medida.

PROTECCIÓN DE LOS FONDOS

La legislación actual prohíbe cualquier disminución en los fondos estatales o federales para el Distrito debido a la adopción por parte del Distrito de un impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación. Sin embargo, si dichos fondos se ven reducidos debido a la adopción de este impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación, el monto del impuesto sobre la parcela para la educación se reducirá anualmente según sea necesario para restaurar dichos fondos estatales o federales.

DIVISIBILIDAD

Por la presente, la Junta de Educación del Distrito declara, y los votantes al aprobar esta medida están de acuerdo, que cada sección, párrafo, oración y cláusula de esta medida tiene un valor independiente, y la Junta de Educación y los votantes habrán adoptado cada disposición de esta con independencia de cualquier otra disposición contenida en la presente. Una vez aprobada esta medida por los votantes, si un tribunal de jurisdicción competente determina que alguna parte es inválida por algún motivo, todas las partes restantes de la misma permanecerán vigentes y efectivas en la extensión permitida por la ley.

**IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS BY COUNTY COUNSEL
MEASURE "G"
MAMMOTH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**

A school district may levy a qualified special tax on property upon approval by two-thirds of the votes cast on a measure pursuant to section 4 of article XIII A of the California Constitution and sections 50075 et seq. of the California Government Code.

The Board of Education ("Board") for the Mammoth Unified School District ("District") proposes to renew and extend an existing parcel tax that expires on June 30, 2022. If approved, the renewed parcel tax shall be effective for five years commencing on July 1, 2022 and shall continue to be levied at the current amount of \$59 per parcel per year of taxable real property within the District.

An exemption from the proposed tax shall be available for any parcel that is occupied by and is a principal residence for a person 65 years or older ("Senior Citizen Exemption") as well as for all property that would otherwise be exempt from property taxes. Property owners seeking the Senior Citizen Exemption must apply to the District for such exemption and property owners who have already qualified for the exemption under the District's current parcel tax measure approved by voters in June 2016 will be automatically qualified for said exemption.

State law requires the District to state the specific purposes for which the tax proceeds will be used and only spend the proceeds of the tax for these purposes. The stated purposes of the tax are to: (1) enhance math and science classes; (2) provide students with books and supplies; (3) attract and retain qualified, high performing teachers; (4) provide updated technology, including software, hardware and support; (5) help maintain smaller class sizes for early grades; (6) enhance student counseling programs; (7) maintain library staff and services; (8) maintain and enhance District language programs; (9) maintain and enhance the District music, arts and enrichment programs; (10) maintain extracurricular activities and athletic programs; and (11) maintain and advance needed educational programs.

The District is required by law to provide additional accountability measures for the proceeds. These measures include: (1) depositing the proceeds into a fund that is separate and apart from other District funds; and (2) providing an annual written report to the Board detailing the amount of funds collected and expended and the status of any project authorized to be funded from the tax proceeds. The Board will appoint an independent Citizen's Oversight Committee to monitor expenditures funded by the measure. An annual, independent performance and financial audit will also be conducted to determine whether taxes processed have been expended only for the specified purposes described in the measure.

Measure G was placed on the ballot by the Board.

A "yes" vote is a vote to approve a parcel tax of \$59 per parcel on taxable parcels within the District for five years commencing on July 1, 2022.

A "no" vote is a vote to not approve a parcel tax of \$59 per parcel on taxable parcels within the District for five years commencing on July 1, 2022.

Un distrito escolar puede gravar un impuesto especial restringido sobre la propiedad con la aprobación de dos tercios de los votos emitidos sobre una medida, de conformidad con la Sección 4 del artículo XIII A de la Constitución de California y las Secciones 50075 y subsecuentes del Código del Gobierno de California.

La Junta de Educación ("Junta") del Distrito Escolar Unificado de Mammoth ("Distrito") propone renovar y ampliar un impuesto actual sobre las parcelas que expira el 30 de junio de 2022. Si se aprueba, la renovación del impuesto a las parcelas tendrá vigencia durante cinco años, a partir del 1.º de julio de 2022 y se seguirá cobrando la cantidad actual de \$59 por parcela, por año, a los inmuebles gravables dentro del Distrito.

Se concederá una exención al impuesto propuesto a toda parcela que sea la residencia principal y esté ocupada por una persona de 65 años o más ("Exención para Ciudadanos de la Tercera Edad") así como a todos los bienes inmuebles que de otra manera quedarían exentos de los impuestos sobre la propiedad. Los propietarios que deseen obtener una Exención para Ciudadanos de la Tercera Edad deberán solicitarla al Distrito, y los propietarios que ya hayan calificado para la exención conforme a la actual medida del impuesto sobre las parcelas del Distrito aprobada por los votantes en junio de 2016 automáticamente calificarán para dicha exención.

La ley estatal exige que el Distrito declare los propósitos específicos para los que se utilizarán los ingresos y que solo gaste los ingresos para estos fines. Los propósitos establecidos del impuesto son: (1) mejorar las clases de matemáticas y ciencias; (2) proporcionar libros y materiales a los estudiantes; (3) atraer y conservar maestros de alto rendimiento y calificados; (4) brindar tecnología actualizada, incluidos software, hardware y soporte; (5) ayudar a mantener grupos de clases reducidos para los primeros grados; (6) mejorar los programas de asesorías estudiantiles; (7) mantener los servicios y el personal de las bibliotecas; (8) mantener y mejorar los programas de idiomas del Distrito; (9) mantener y mejorar los programas de música, artes y enriquecimiento del Distrito; (10) mantener los programas de atletismo y actividades extracurriculares, y (11) mantener y mejorar los programas educativos necesarios.

La ley le exige al Distrito que proporcione medidas de rendición de cuentas adicionales para los ingresos. Dichas medidas incluyen: (1) depositar los ingresos en un fondo separado y aparte de los otros fondos del Distrito y (2) proporcionar un informe anual por escrito a la Junta donde se indique de manera detallada la cantidad de fondos recaudados y gastados, y el estado de cualquier proyecto autorizado que se vaya a financiar con los ingresos provenientes del impuesto. La Junta designará un Comité de Supervisión Ciudadana Independiente para supervisar los gastos financiados por la medida. También se llevará a cabo una auditoría financiera independiente anual de desempeño para determinar si los ingresos de los impuestos se gastaron exclusivamente para los propósitos descritos en la medida.

La Junta incluyó la Medida G en la boleta.

Un voto "Sí" es un voto para aprobar el impuesto a las parcelas de \$59 por parcela sobre las parcelas gravables dentro del Distrito durante cinco años a partir del 1.º de julio de 2022.

Un voto "No" es un voto para no aprobar el impuesto a las parcelas de \$59 por parcela sobre las parcelas gravables dentro del Distrito durante cinco años a partir del 1.º de julio de 2022.

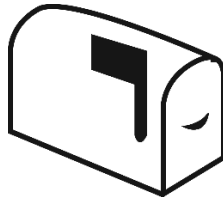

Hand delivering it to the Mono County Elections office; or

Dropping it off at any polling place, vote center, vote-by-mail drop-off location, or drop box in the state.
