

June Lake Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC)
April 3, 2019 - Meeting Minutes

1. Call to Order @ 6:06pm by Secretary Lindsey Chargin
2. Public Comment
 - a. Bob Gardner – Supervisor Report
 - i. Snow storage issues are starting to pop up – needs to be dealt with before next snow storage issue arises (solutions might be transporting out like mammoth, working on solving parking issues)
 - ii. Runoff occurrences – Southern California Edison (SCE) already working with Down Canyon businesses and individuals on this
 - iii. Fishing regulations – new Department of Fish and Wildlife (DFW) regulations include major revisions – check out the DFW site if you care about fishing!
 - iv. Eastern Sierra Transit Authority (ESTA) June Lake Summer Shuttle likely not running due to lack of drivers (in Mammoth)
 - v. Fires – goal is to have fire town hall on fire ecology with education for community – happening 5/22 in Mammoth – if there is enough interest we can do a meeting in June also – separately we might have a town hall on how to fire protect your home
